- **3** Board , 2x2 , 96"
- **4** Board , 1x3 , 96"


### Hardware & Supplies

- 50 21/2" Blue Kreg Screws Coarse
- 25 2" Wood Screws
- 1 Outdoor Primer
- 1 Outdoor Paint
- 1 Wood Putty



## Cut List & Parts

- **4** Legs , 17" X 2" X 2"
- 4 Short Aprons And Leg Supports , 17" X 2" X2"
- **2** Top Supports , 17" X 2" X 2"
- **2** Long Aprons , 29" X 2" X 2"
- 1 Bottom Long Support , 29" X 2" X 2"
- **8** Top Slats , 35" X 1" X 3"






# Directions

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### Make side frames

Create the 2 side frames using the Legs, short apron and the bottom leg supports. The bottom leg support are 3" from the edge of the leg.








### attach long aprons

Attach the long aprons and create the table frame.








### **Attach bottom support**

Attach the bottom long support. This is 7.75" from the side of the leg.








### **Attach table supports**

Attach the table top supports. I attached these 11" from each end.







### Assemble table top slats

Assemble the table top slats onto the frame. I used 1.5" overhang on both sides of the slats. The first slat was attached flush on the inside edge of the long apron giving a 1" overhang in the front of the table. I used a yard stick which was about 1/4" thick as a spacer between the slats.
