Wood Products

- **1** Board , 1x6 , 96"
- **1** Board, 1x4, 72"

Hardware & Supplies

- 1 Set Of Hairpin Legs
- 1 Special Walnut Stain
- 1 Clear Gloss Polycrylic



Cut List & Parts

- **2** Tabletop, 1 X 4 X 26"
- **2** Tabletop, 1 X 6 X 26"
- **2** Tabletop, 1 X 6 X 18"




Directions

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Step 1.

Build the top of the coffee table.

Attach the boards as shown with wood glue and 1-1/4" pocket holes and screws. Place pocket holes on the bottom side of the tabletop to best hide them.







Step 2.For additional support, attach a set of "cleats" to the bottom of the table top.



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Step 3.Sand and finish the tabletop as desired.







Step 4.

Attach hairpin legs to the bottom of the tabletop.
