
25 Pocket Hole Screws

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


Directions

Step 1


Cut the table top planks and drill 3/4" pocket holes, as shown on the cut list. Attach the planks together with 11/4" pocket hole screws.

Step 2

Measure and cut the breadboards to size. Attach them to the ends of the planks with 11/4" pocket hole screws and wood glue.




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Step 3


Cut the base pieces to size and drill 1 1/2" pocket holes into the angled ends of each foot. Attach the feet to the runner with 2 1/2" pocket hole screws and wood glue.Build two of these bases.





Step 4

Cut the legs to size and attach them to the top base with 2 1/2" wood screws from the top of the base and into the legs. The pocket holes should face up.




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Step 5


Flip the base over and attach the bottom base with wood glue and 2 1/2" wood screws from the bottom of the bottom base and into the legs. The pocket holes should face down.



Step 6

With the table top upside down, center the base on top of it. Attach the table base to the top with 2 1/2" wood screws from the top of the base and into the table top.




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Step 7
