## Mudroom Bench with Shoe Storage

## Difficulty

Easy
This mudroom bench is not only a place to sit while putting on your shoes, but it is also a place to keep your shoes neatly tucked away and up off the floor. I added a second shelf exclusively for slippers to keep them clean and dirt free.

## Cut List \& Parts

4 4x4, @163/4"
4 2x4, @39"
$62 \times 4, @ 13$ "
4 1×4, @39"
4 1×4, @46"
$42 \times 6, @ 48^{\prime \prime}$

Directions

## Step 1

Cut all of your pieces as stated in the cut list and drill your pocket holes in the $2 \times 4$ boards. This plan requires pocket holes at each end of every $2 \times 4$ cut.

Step 2
Attach (2) 39" boards and (2) 13" boards 1" up on the $4 \times 4$ legs using $27 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ pocket hole screws and wood glue.


## Step 3

Attach 2 of the $39^{\prime \prime} 1 \times 4$ cuts and 2 of the $46^{\prime \prime} 1 \times 4$ cuts over the $2 \times 4$ s using wood glue and $17 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ brad nails. Space them $2^{\prime \prime}$ apart


## Overview

4
The measurements for this bench are $48 \times 22 \times 18.5^{\prime \prime}$. It is pretty deep and can be adjusted in the plans if you would like it a little thinner. But this depth allows you to have a coat rack above the bench and still be able to sit without having coats in your way.

5 Step 4
Repeat Step 3 adding the $2 \times 4$ boards 11" up from the bottom of the $4 \times 4$ legs.

## Step 5

Add (1) 13 " piece on either end, between the $4 \times 4$ s, 15.5 " up from the bottom. You will want the pocket holes facing up for these pieces. It will make it easier to attach them and the pocket holes will be covered by the top.


## Step 6

7
Attach the $2 \times 6$ boards to the top of the bench using wood glue and $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ nails. Leave a one inch overhang on all sides.
