1 Post , 3 1/2" X 3 1/2" , 48"

1 Pre-made Cap , 4x4 , Wood Post Cap

1 Wood Finial , Mfg. Standard , Pre-made

Hardware & Supplies

12 3" Wood Screws

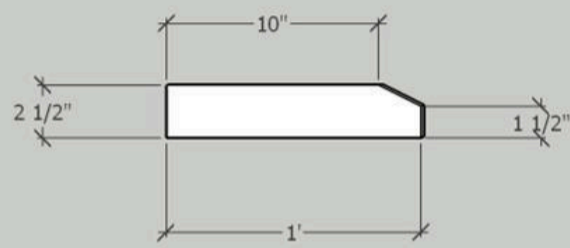
Cut List & Parts

1 Post, 3 1/2" X 3 1/2" X 42"

4 Feet, 1 1/2" X 2 1/2" X 12"

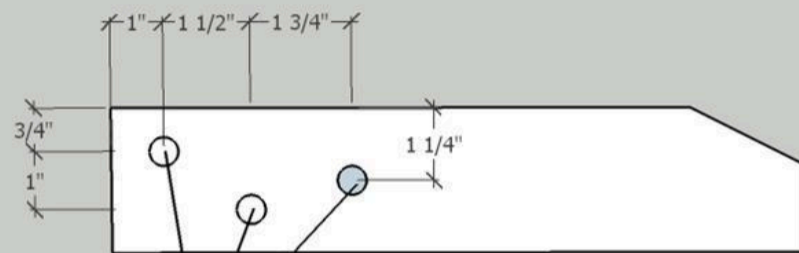

Drill holes in feet

Drill counter sunk holes in the feet in locations as shown

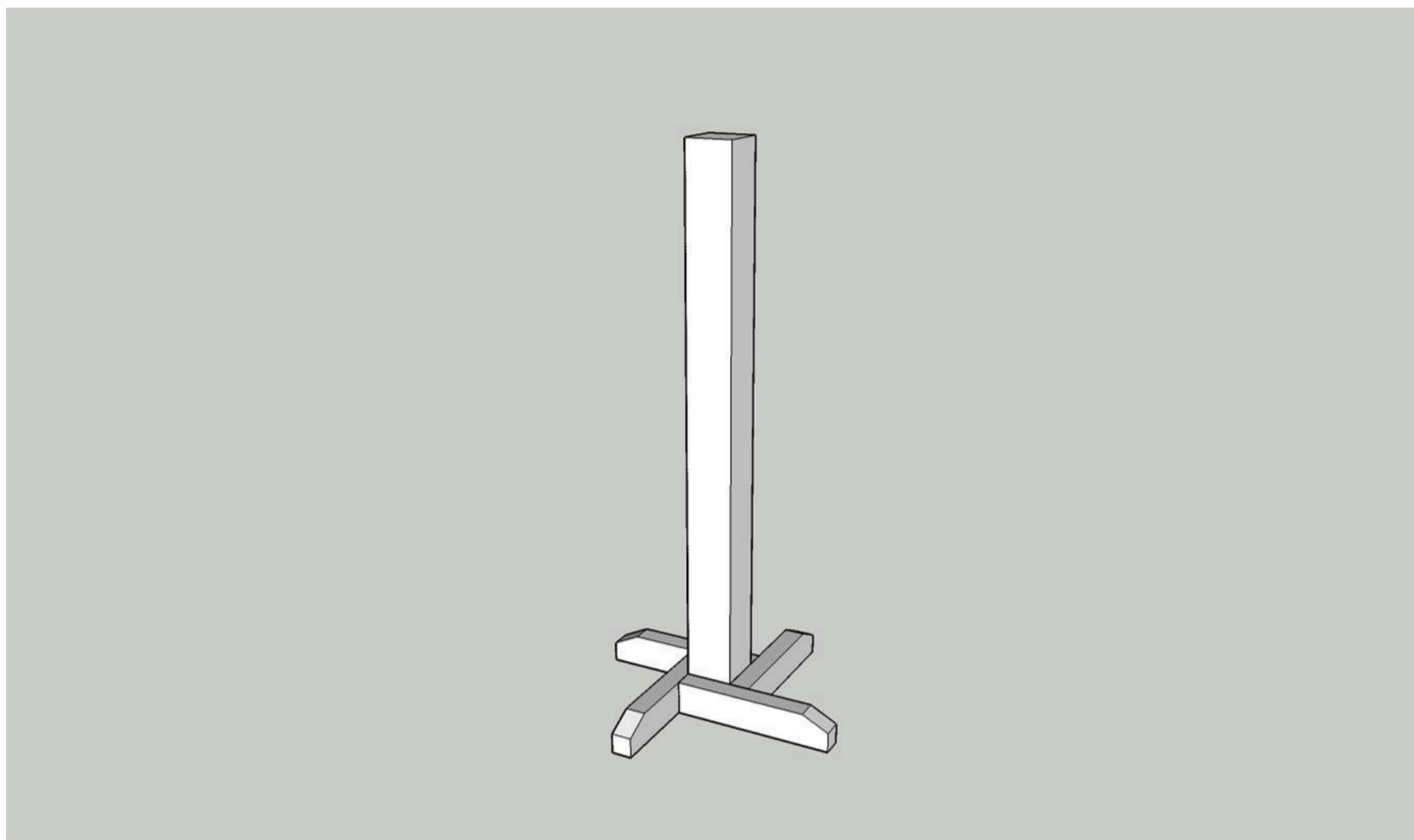


Counter sunk holes

Install the feet

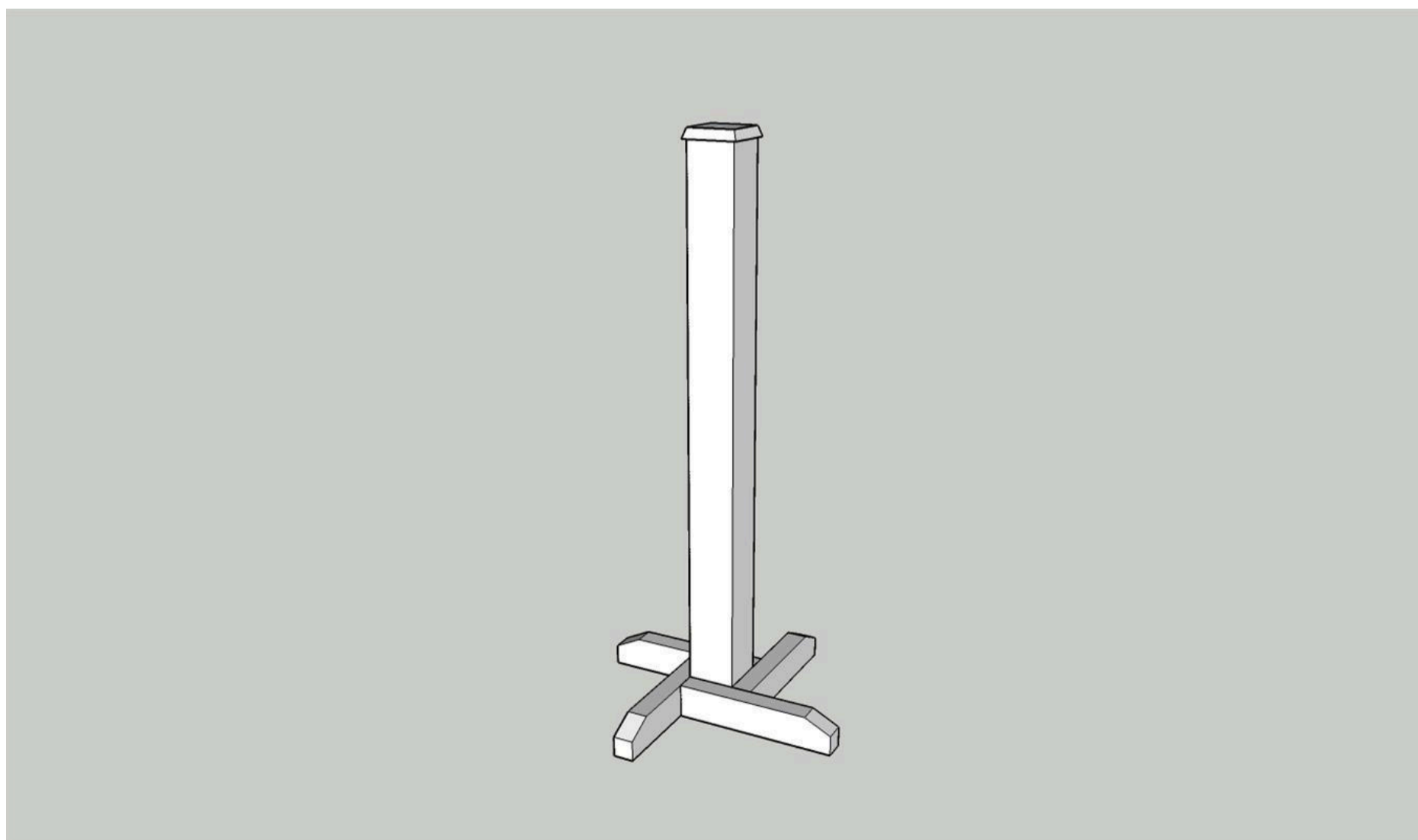
Install the feet utilizing 3" wood screws

Install the cap

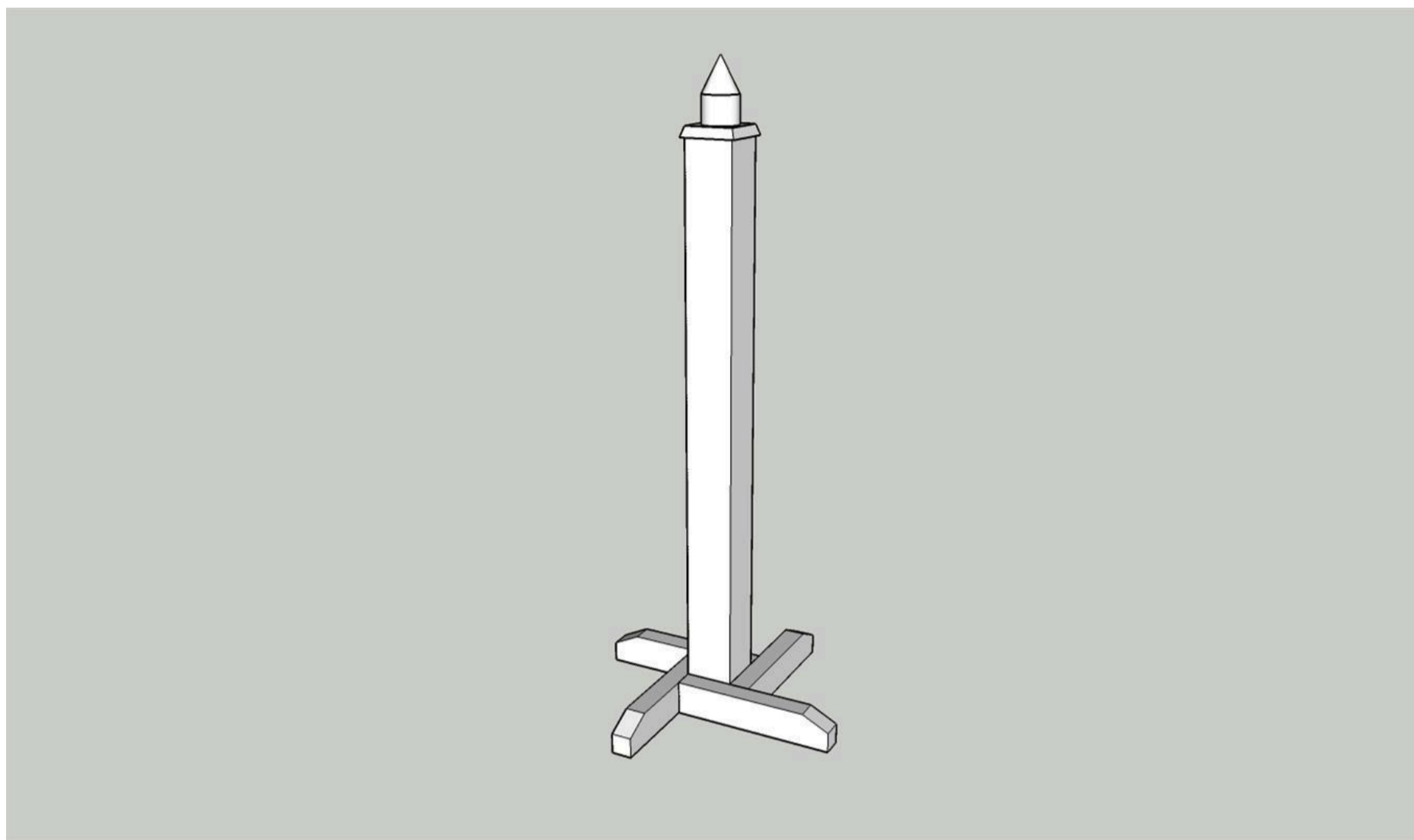
Install the post cap by glueing and nailing the cap in place.

Install the finial

Install the finial screwing through the wood cap into the post

Sand and paint

Fill the screw holes, sand and paint the post, cap and feet in any color you desire.
