- 1 Board , 2x3 , 48"
- 1 Post , 3 1/2" X 3 1/2" , 48"
- 1 Pre-made Cap , 4x4 , Wood Post Cap
- 1 Wood Finial , Mfg. Standard , Pre-made

### Hardware & Supplies

- 12 3" Wood Screws

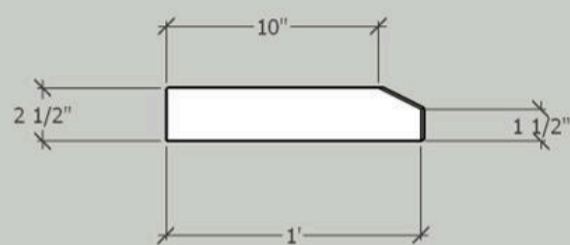
# Cut List & Parts

1 Post, 3 1/2" X 3 1/2" X 42"

4 Feet, 1 1/2" X 2 1/2" X 12"

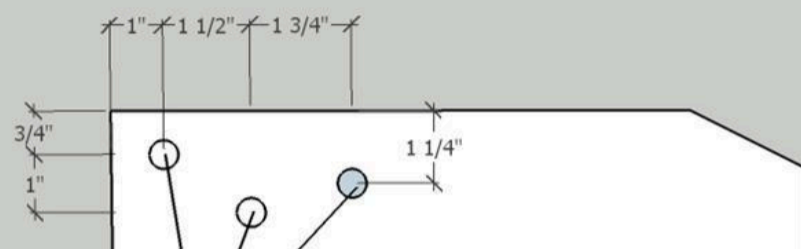

# Directions

**1****Drill holes in feet**

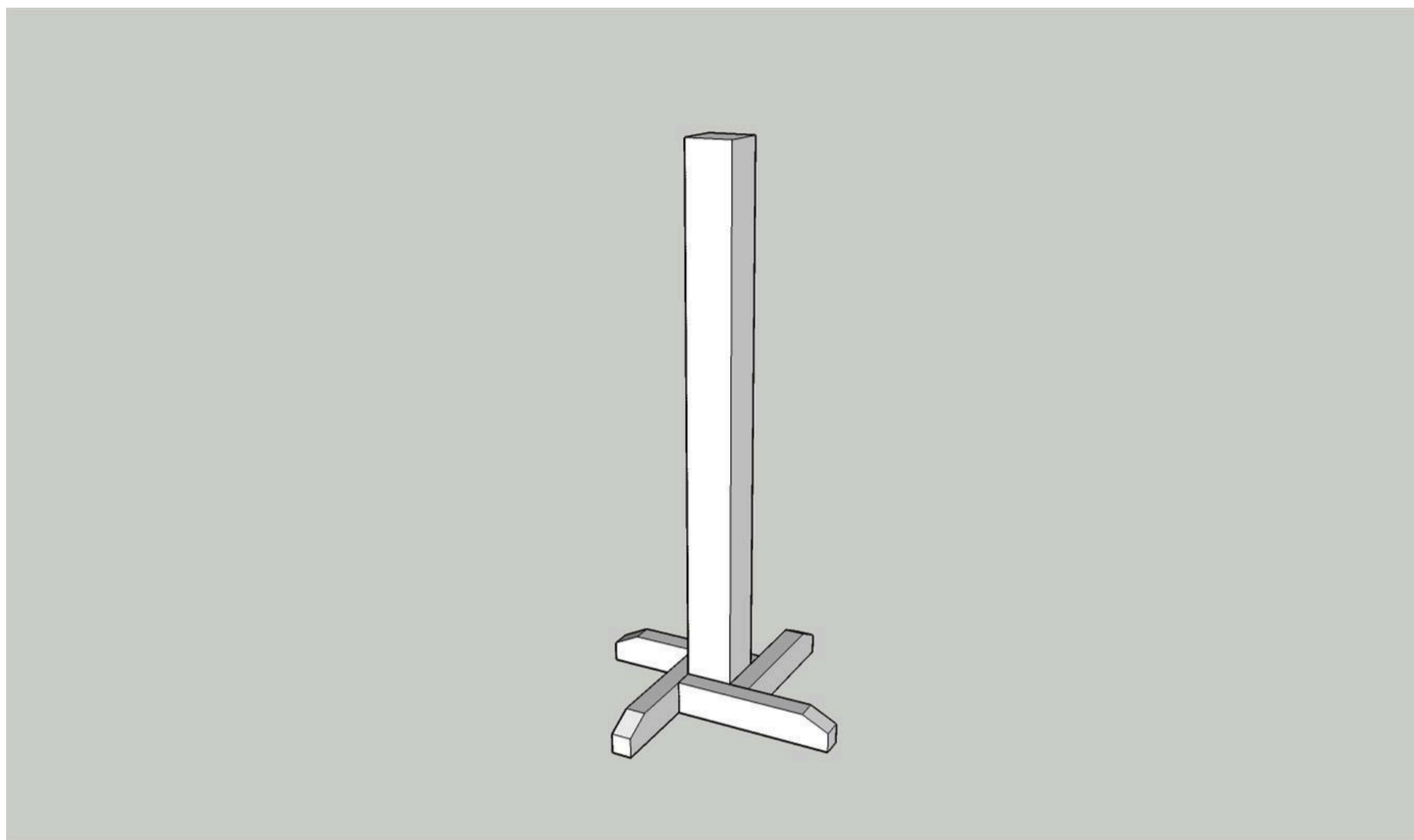
Drill counter sunk holes in the feet in locations as shown



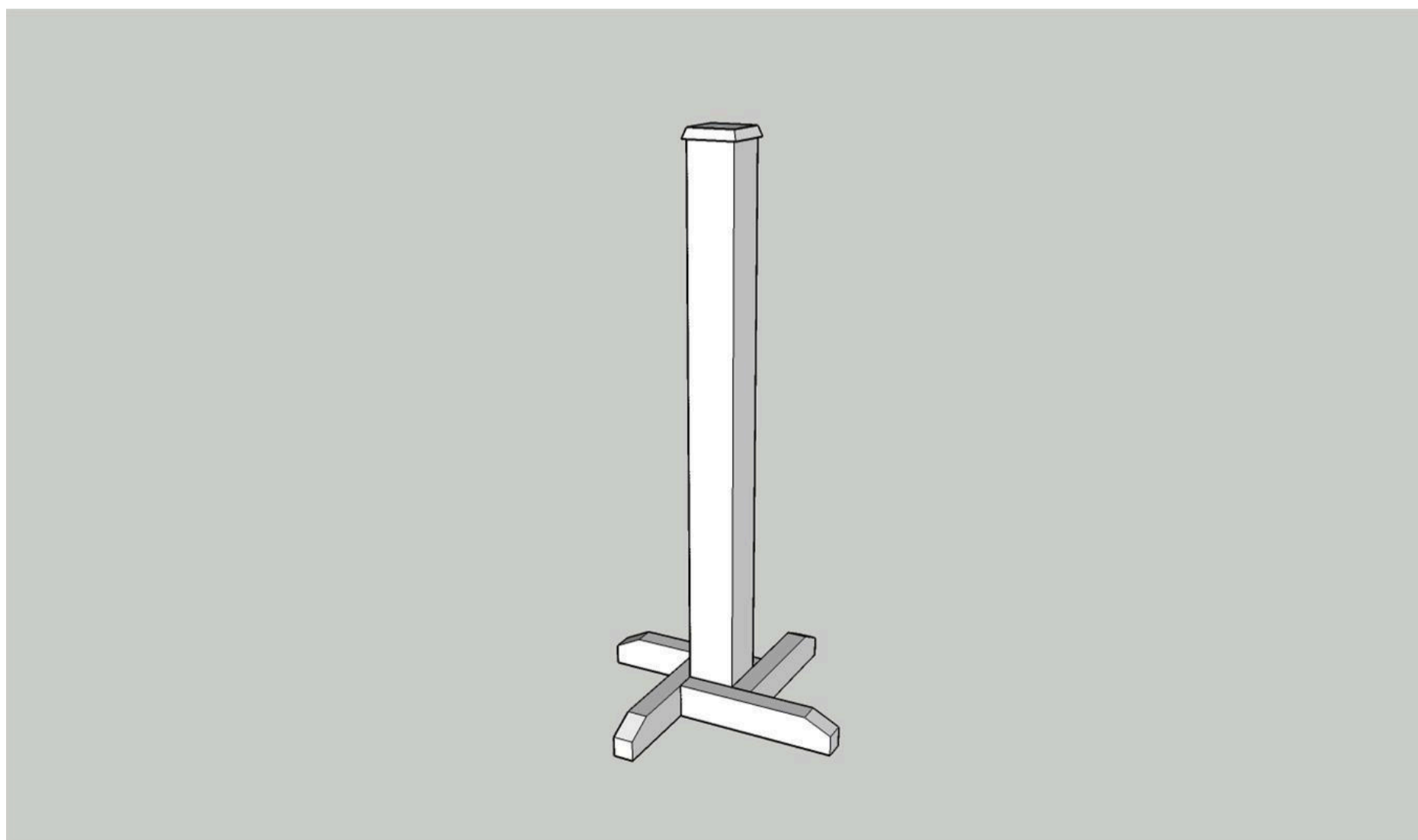
Counter sunk holes

**2****Install the feet**

Install the feet utilizing 3" wood screws

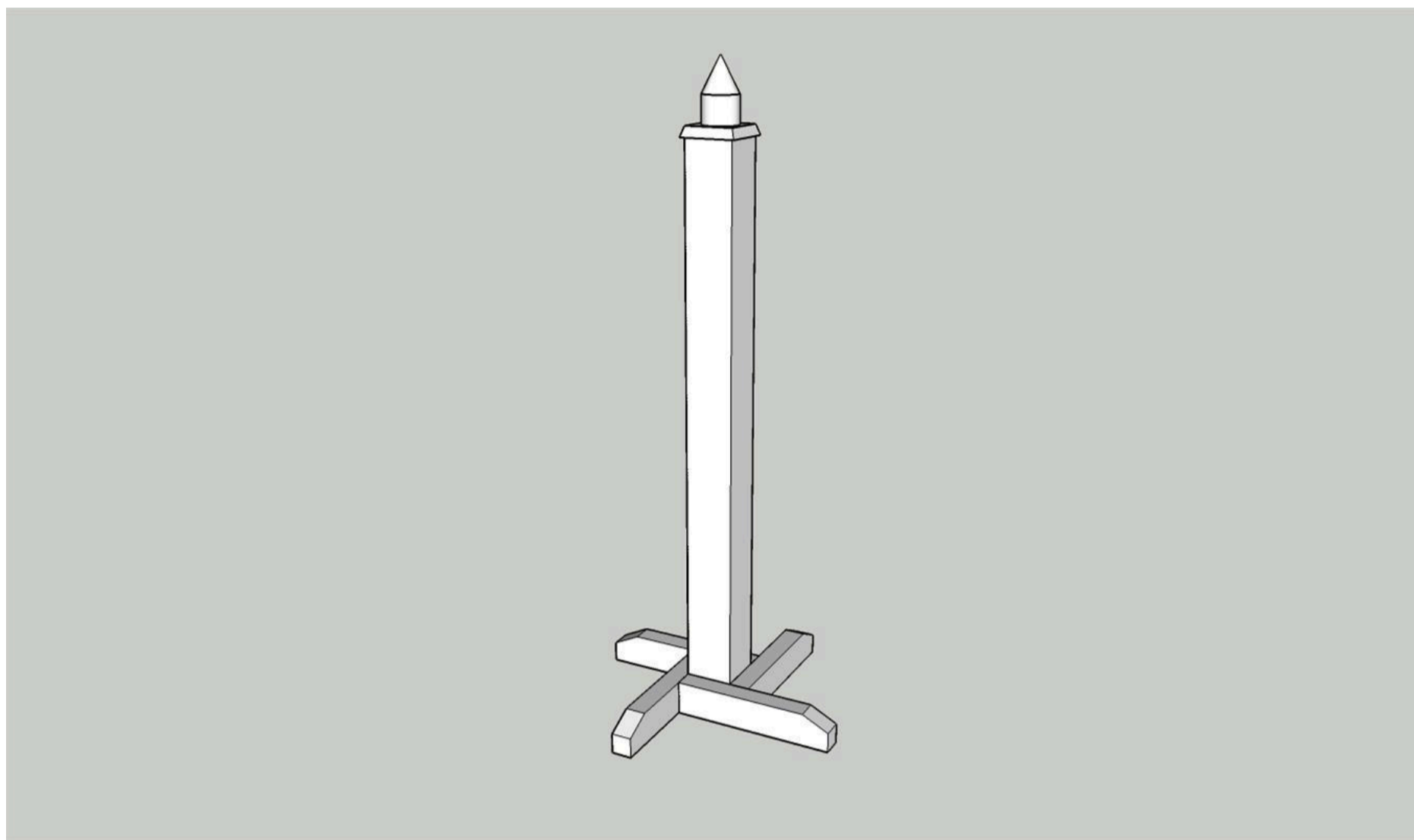
**3****Install the cap**

Install the post cap by glueing and nailing the cap in place.



**4****Install the finial**

Install the finial screwing through the wood cap into the post

**5****Sand and paint**

Fill the screw holes, sand and paint the post, cap and feet in any color you desire.

Add decorative holiday custom mdf shapes and personalize with mdf letters.
